“With his extensive experience in government affairs, health care and association management, we believe Bill Prentice is the right person at the right time for this key position within the ASC community,” says ASC Association/Ambulatory Surgery Foundation Board Chair David Shapiro, MD. “With his background, we expect him to be an effective advocate for all of the diverse stakeholder groups represented in the ASC community.”

Prentice has more than 25 years of experience in association management, government affairs, health care advocacy and legislation, and public relations. His professional experience includes more than 17 years working directly with health care organizations and 12 years of experience on Capitol Hill.

Most recently, Prentice was the senior vice president of Government and Public Affairs and director of the Washington Office of the American Dental Association (ADA). In that capacity, he oversaw all federal and state government relations, advocacy communications and political action for the 157,000-member ADA.

Before joining the ADA as a senior congressional lobbyist in 1999, Prentice was director of government affairs at the New Jersey Dental Association, where he also served as executive director of the state political action committee. Before that, he worked on behalf of numerous clients as a vice president at a large New Jersey public affairs firm. He started his career as legislative staff on Capitol Hill.

Prentice holds an undergraduate degree in political science from George Washington University, a master’s degree in government administration from the University of Pennsylvania and a law degree from Rutgers’ School of Law. He is married with three daughters.
